Library services began in Glen Park in 1927 at 700 Bosworth Street. When that building was demolished to make way for Interstate 280, the branch was housed in several leased locations over the years. In 1978, it was relocated to 653 Chenery Street, a site owned by Wilhelm and Val Tietz, longtime friends, patrons, landlords and staunch supporters of the Library. It opened at its current location on Diamond Street in 2007, in a multiuse building with space designated specifically for the Library.

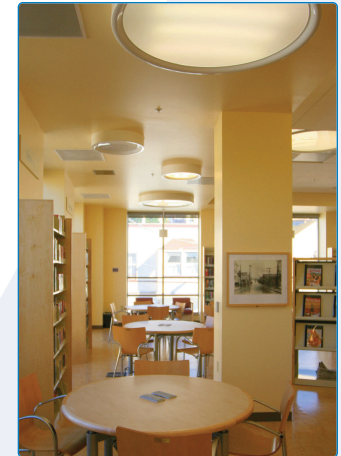
