#### **BIOGRAPHY**

Although Cliff Anchor was romantically involved with two men more famous than himself (namely, Dr. Tom Dooley and Vietnam veteran Leonard Matlovich), he was an accomplished person in his own right -- a military man, radio broadcaster, and gay rights activist.

Anchor was born in Walton, Waterloo, England on August 20, 1936. At the age of 17, Anchor immigrated to Canada and changed his name to Michael Erickson. In 1959, at the age of 23, he met his first lover, Dr. Thomas Dooley, a U.S. Navy doctor famous for his work with Dr. Albert Schweitzer in Southeast Asia.

In the early 1960s, Anchor (then still known as Erickson) moved to San Francisco and began working in the radio industry. He became a U.S. citizen in 1966, and joined the California National Guard in 1973, eventually reaching the rank of Lt. Colonel. Around this time, he also began operating radio station KRJB-FM based in Monte Rio, California. KRJB-FM was notable not just for the variety of programming it featured – from community affairs to music to military news – but it was also the very first station in the country to air National Gay Network News.

In 1979, Anchor met gay rights activist Leonard P. Matlovich through mutual friends in San Francisco. A courtship ensued, and the two agreed to settle down together in Guerneville, California. In 1985, Anchor sold KRJB-FM, and in 1988 Matlovich died. With major chapters of his life coming to an end, Anchor decided to fully come out of the closet and also reclaim his birth name – Cliff Anchor. Not forgetting his commitment to

service for his country, Anchor volunteered for several military intelligence missions in the early 1990s.

By the mid-1990s, Anchor was an outspoken advocate for gay rights at various levels, particularly within the U.S. Military. He was featured prominently in the book *One Million Strong: The 1993 March on Washington for Lesbian, Gay, and Bisexual Rights*, as well as the book *Conduct Unbecoming* by Randy Shilts on gays in the military. By the end of his life, Anchor had served on a seemingly infinite number of civic and activist posts, including Vice Commander of the Alexander Hamilton Post #448 of the American Legion in San Francisco, the only GLBT post in the nation. Anchor died on July 18, 2000, at his home on the Russian River.

#### **SCOPE AND CONTENT**

This collection comprises materials that Cliff Anchor, a prominent activist for gays in the military, authored or kept in his private possession from 1959 to 2000. These documents include speeches, correspondence, papers related to military service, materials related to Leonard Matlovich's memorial, documents related to radio station KJRB and American Legion Alexander Hamilton Post #448, clippings, photographs, VHS videos, and artifacts.

#### **SERIES DESCRIPTIONS**

# Series 1: PERSONAL CORRESPONDENCE AND PAPERS. 17 folders.

Arranged into four subseries: General Personal Correspondence, Volunteer Projects, Materials Related to Tom Dooley, and Materials Related to Leonard Matlovich.

### **Subseries 1A: General Personal Correspondence** (12 folders).

Arranged chronologically, this subseries comprises various correspondence from Anchor's family and friends.

### **Subseries 1B: Volunteer Projects** (1 folder).

Arranged chronologically, this subseries comprises correspondence, flyers, and other papers related to Anchor's more prominent volunteer projects in the gay rights and military spheres, including the Wall of Restitution art installation and Anchor's participation as a U.S. Delegate at Large to NATO Conferences in 1989 and 1990.

#### **Subseries 1C: Materials Related to Tom Dooley** (2 folders).

Arranged chronologically, this subseries comprises Anchor's remembrances of his relationship with Tom Dooley, and clippings related to Dooley's legacy. It also includes a copy of the book *Dr. Tom Dooley's Three Great Books* (New York: Farrar, Straus & Cudahy, 1956, 1958, 1960), with handwritten recollections by Anchor.

#### **Subseries 1D: Materials Related to Leonard Matlovich** (2 folders).

Arranged chronologically, this subseries comprises material related to Anchor's spouse Leonard P. Matlovich, including correspondence between Anchor and Matlovich's parents, and memorial planning and service documents. Several newspaper and magazine clippings honoring Matlovich's memory are also included.

# Series 2: PROFESSIONAL CORRESPONDENCE AND PAPERS. 54 folders + 1 oversized folder.

Arranged into seven subseries: General Professional Correspondence, Speeches & Editorials, Alexander Hamilton Post #448, KRJB Radio, Intelligence papers, Campaign for Sonoma County Supervisor, and Certificates & Awards.

### **Subseries 2A:** General Professional Correspondence (16 folders).

Arranged chronologically, this subseries comprises various correspondence related to Anchor's activity within the military and various organizations, including gay rights and veterans groups.

#### **Subseries 2B: Speeches & Editorials** (2 folders).

Arranged chronologically, this subseries comprises the text of speeches that Anchor delivered at public speaking events. It also includes letters to the editor and editorials authored by Anchor that were published in various newspapers, including the *Russian River Times*.

## **Subseries 2C: Alexander Hamilton Post #448** (14 folders).

Arranged chronologically, this subseries comprises correspondence, newsletters, meeting agendas, member directories, and other documents related to the American Legion Alexander Hamilton Post #448 based in San Francisco, California, the first openly gay and lesbian post in the nation. Anchor served as Vice Commander and Press Officer of this post.

#### Subseries 2D: KRJB Radio (14 folders).

Arranged chronologically, this subseries comprises correspondence, radio show play lists, legal documents, and publicity related to the radio station KRJB-FM based in Monte Rio, California, which Anchor operated from 1969 to 1985 with the assistance of Robert Booth.

#### **Subseries 2E: Military Intelligence Papers** (4 folders).

Arranged chronologically, this subseries comprises material (including diaries of operations) related to Anchor's military intelligence missions for the U.S. Government: one a secret mission in Panama in 1990 to deliver classified documents, the other a 1991-1992 mission spying on arms dealers in the Middle East. Anchor's correspondence with federal intelligence agents is also included.

#### **Subseries 2F: Campaign for Sonoma County Supervisor** (3 folders).

Arranged chronologically, this subseries comprises clippings, correspondence, publicity, research, and other materials related to Anchor's 1988 campaign for Sonoma County Supervisor, 5<sup>th</sup> District, against incumbent Ernie Carpenter.

#### **Subseries 2G: Certificates & Awards** (1 folder + 1 oversized folder).

Arranged chronologically, this subseries comprises certificates and awards earned by Anchor throughout his professional life, primarily from military and law enforcement positions.

# Series 3: CLIPPINGS. 12 folders.

Arranged into three subseries: Articles Written by Anchor, Clippings about Anchor, and General Clippings.

#### **Subseries 3A: Articles Written by Anchor** (1 folder).

Arranged chronologically, this subseries comprises general articles written by Anchor. Editorials and letters to editors of publications are filed in Subseries 2B (Speeches & Editorials).

## **Subseries 3B: Clippings about Anchor** (2 folders).

Arranged chronologically, this subseries comprises press appearances by Anchor in newspapers and magazines.

### **Subseries 3C:** General Clippings (9 folders).

Arranged chronologically, this subseries comprises a vast array of articles chronicling gays in the military, anti-gay religious figures, media programming, and general gay rights issues.

# Series 4: AUDIOVISUAL MATERIALS, 1977-1997. 21 VHS videotapes and 3 audiocassette tapes.

Arranged by format and then chronologically, this series comprises VHS video tapes and audio tapes featuring Anchor and issues related to gays in the military.

# Series 5: PHOTOGRAPHS AND NEGATIVES. 6 folders.

#### **Subseries 5A: Personal Photographs** (1 folder).

Arranged chronologically, this subseries comprises general personal photographs of Anchor with family and friends.

### **Subseries 5B: Tom Dooley Photographs** (1 folder).

Arranged chronologically, this subseries comprises photographs of Tom Dooley.

#### **Subseries 5C: Matlovich Photographs** (1 folder).

Arranged chronologically, this subseries comprises photographs of events at Leonard Matlovich's memorial, as well as several photographs of Matlovich himself. It also includes a copy of the photo-documentary book *March on* 

*Washington* (Boston: Alyson Publications, 1993), which features handwritten recollections by Anchor.

## **Subseries 5D: Military Photographs** (1 folder).

Arranged chronologically, this subseries comprises photographs of Anchor in uniform at various military events.

## **Subseries 5E: Radio Station Photographs** (1 folder).

Arranged chronologically, this subseries comprises photographs taken at Anchor's radio station, KRJB FM in Monte Rio, California.

# Series 6: ARTIFACTS. 16 items.

Artifacts include Anchor's British passport, a Medal of Merit and one Membership Achievement Medal from the Alexander Hamilton Post #448, a beret with pin of Alexander Hamilton Post #448, a few award plaques from the California National Guard, a single chevron shoulder patch, a memorial plaque for Leonard P.
