- The Laptop Use Agreement must be signed in the presence of a library staff member at the ervice Desk and valid ID must be shown as prescribed in the "Get a Library Card" guidelines on he Eaptop Computer

Replacement cost: \$500.

Patron Responsibility Laptop & mifi bundle users must check out the equipment at the Service Desk and must show their current library card at the desk (or a valid California Driver's license showing residential address or valid California State Identification Card showing residential address)

Laptop users agree to assume responsibility for proper use and care of library equipment and for returning interpretations and the second control of the over, the borrower is responsible for returning the equipment to the Service Desir of the original checkout library. Users will be required to wait while the lanton and peripherals are inspected to insure that the equipment is in the same condition as when it was checked out and that all equipment is intact and present before the laptop & mifi device is checked in.

Failure to return a laptop & mili bundle on time to the Service Desk will result in suspension of laptop & mili boryowing essilence period of the converse will be disabled by library staff.

Replacement cost: \$50. Vandalizing, abusing or stealing Library materials or equipment is prohibited under the Library's "Guidelines for Use" and will result in suspension of library privileges. In addition, patrons who steal, vandalize or abuse a laptop or mifi device may be reported to law enforcement authorities and be subject to criminal and/or civil penalties.

Mifi DEAPTOPS & MIELDEVICES SHOULD NOT BE LOANED TO ANOTHER PERSON.

Loan Periods

Replacement cost: \$10.

- · Laptop & mifi bundle loan period is three weeks.
- Laptop & mifi bundles should be returned to the Check Out desk at the same library from which they were borrowed.
- · Laptop & mifi bundles cannot be dropped in the library book return drop; they must be returned to a Ibrawistar Device Caselie descriving tielar protective case

Replacement cost: \$10. User Files Patrons should save their documents to an external storage device. All files and downloads will be deleted when the laptop is turned off so please remember to save your work
