


#### Phased Reopening Plan

#### **Browse & Bounce**

#### Face masks are required

No entry is allowed without a face mask covering your nose and mouth.



#### **Behavior Expectations**

- Wear a facial covering
- Maintain physical distancing
- Follow Patron Code of Conduct and other posted and/or verbal instructions from staff

#### **Behavior Expectations**

- Patrons will be requested to limit their time in the Library to 1 hour.
- Anyone engaging in activity outside of the stated available services will be asked to leave.
- Anyone who violates the public health order will be asked to leave.

#### **Facilities Modifications**

- Social distancing markers and signs
- Hand sanitizing stations for public
- Sneeze guards at service points
- Seating removed
- Public restrooms open for library patrons

# Main Library Phased Reopening

- First phase to reopening the Main
  - Spring 2021
  - Atrium level only with restricted capacity and suggested time limit
  - SFPL To Go will continue at Larkin
  - Staffed desks at Info Services and Borrower Services
  - Public computers for internet access and free printing
  - Browsing popular 1<sup>st</sup> floor collections
  - Paging circ items from upper floors
  - Piloting reference by appointment in SF History Center
- Followed quickly by reopening the Children's Center and The Mix
- Next phase expanding to upper floors


- Grove Street entrance as Main entrance
