Rick Gerharter is a San Francisco based freelance photojournalist who has been documenting the LGBT communities since 1987. His work has appeared in numerous international and national publications, most regularly in the weekly newspaper, the *Bay Area Reporter*. His work is featured in the books: *Out in the Castro: desire, promise, activism*; *Witness the Love: stories from the heart of the AIDS epidemic*; *Gay by the Bay* ;and *Out in America: a portrait of gay and lesbian life* ;and appears in numerous other books, videos and publications.

This collection of 26 black and white images selected by the artist documents activities in San Francisco's LGBT community from 1988 through mid-1995. Many were shot on assignment for the *Bay Area Reporter* and capture the intensity and emotion of many facets of queer life, including AIDS activism, celebration, care-giving, sports, and visibility.
