- Best Value Project Delivery Method
- Bidding Process
- Preliminary Bid Results
- Next Steps

BEST VALUE PROJECT DELIVERY METHOD

- Alternative to conventional low-bid contracting
- Bidders provide *qualifications proposal* and *bid pricing*
- **Goal:** *Historic Building Experience*
 + Competitive Bid
- Proposals are scored by an independent panel
- Proposal Score / Bid Price = Best Value Tabulation
- ***Lowest Best Value Tabulation = Successful bidder***

<i>August 31</i>	<i>Bid Proposals Received</i>
<i>Sept 6-9</i>	<i>Best-Value Panel Evaluation</i>
Sept 19 - 23	Best-Value Tabulation
Sept – Dec	Contract award process

PRELIMINARY BID RESULTS

- 3 Bid packages received
- 2 were responsive
- Best-Value Tabulation results will be opened week of 9/19

NEXT STEPS

- Complete the bid protest period
- Public Works contracting review and approval
- Public Works Commission resolution
- Public Works Commission Hearing – December 2
 - Public Works Commission approval constitutes award*
- Construction start – Winter 2023

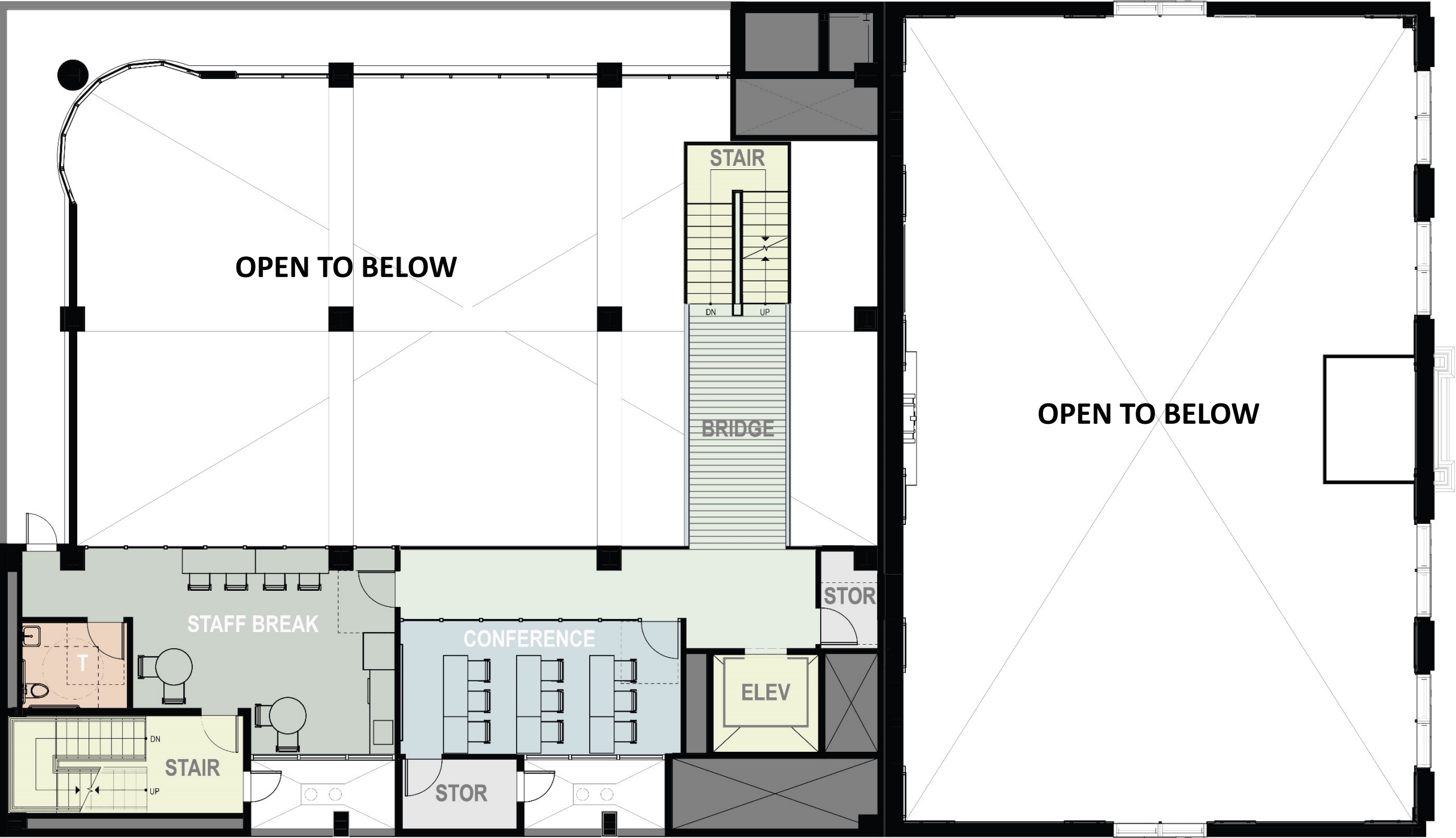
GROUND FLOOR PLAN



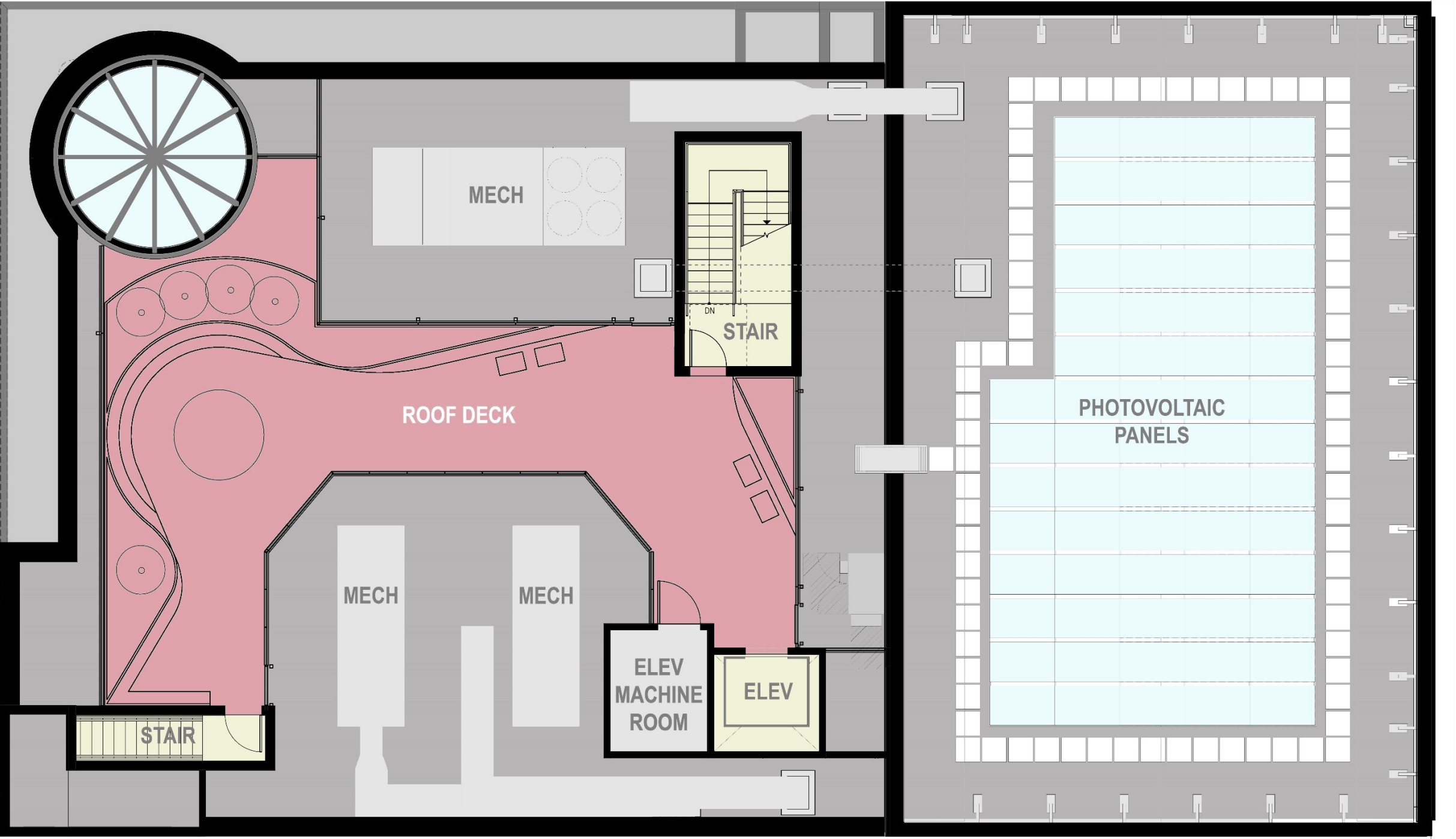

MAIN FLOOR PLAN

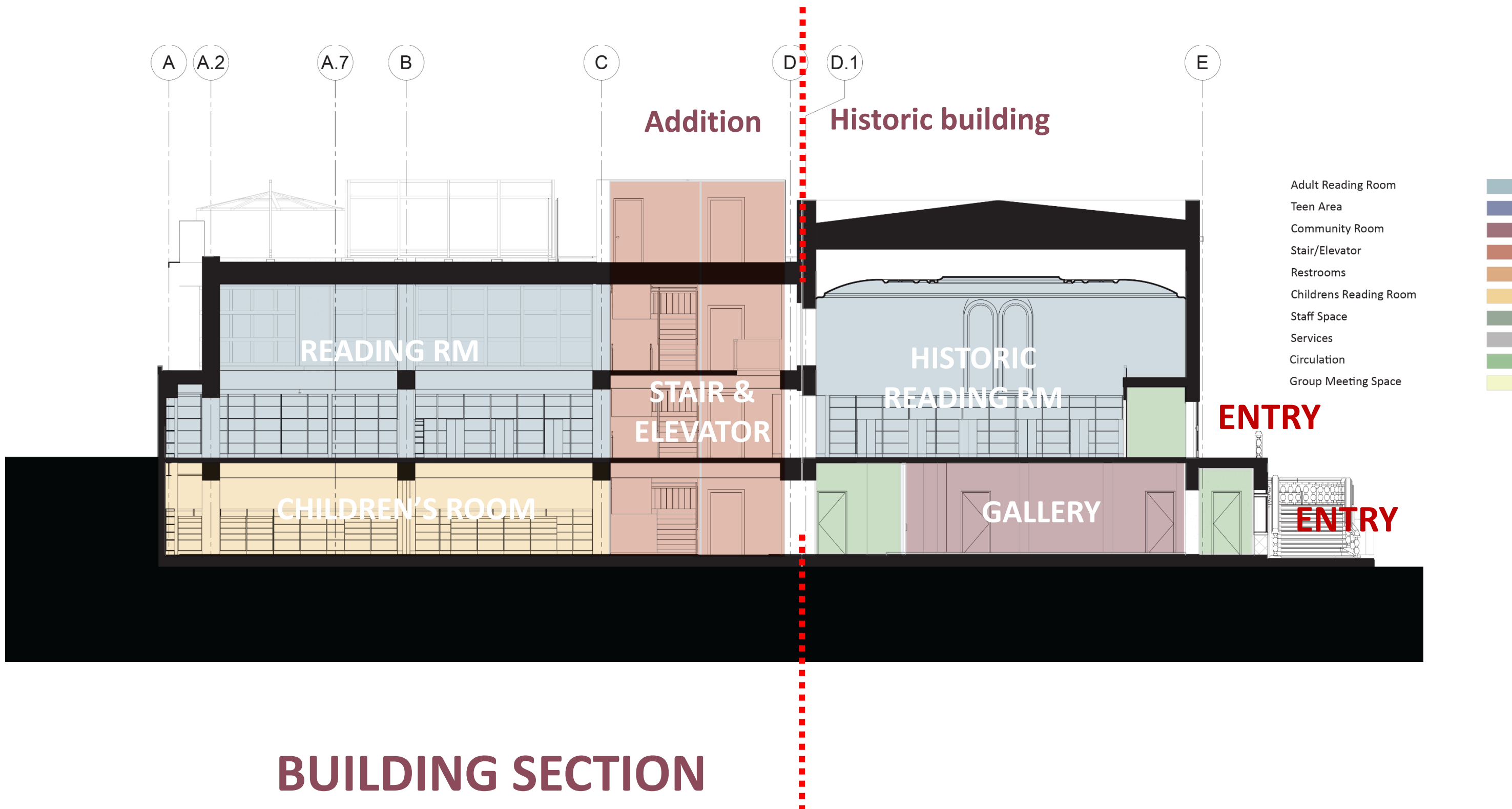


MEZZANINE FLOOR PLAN

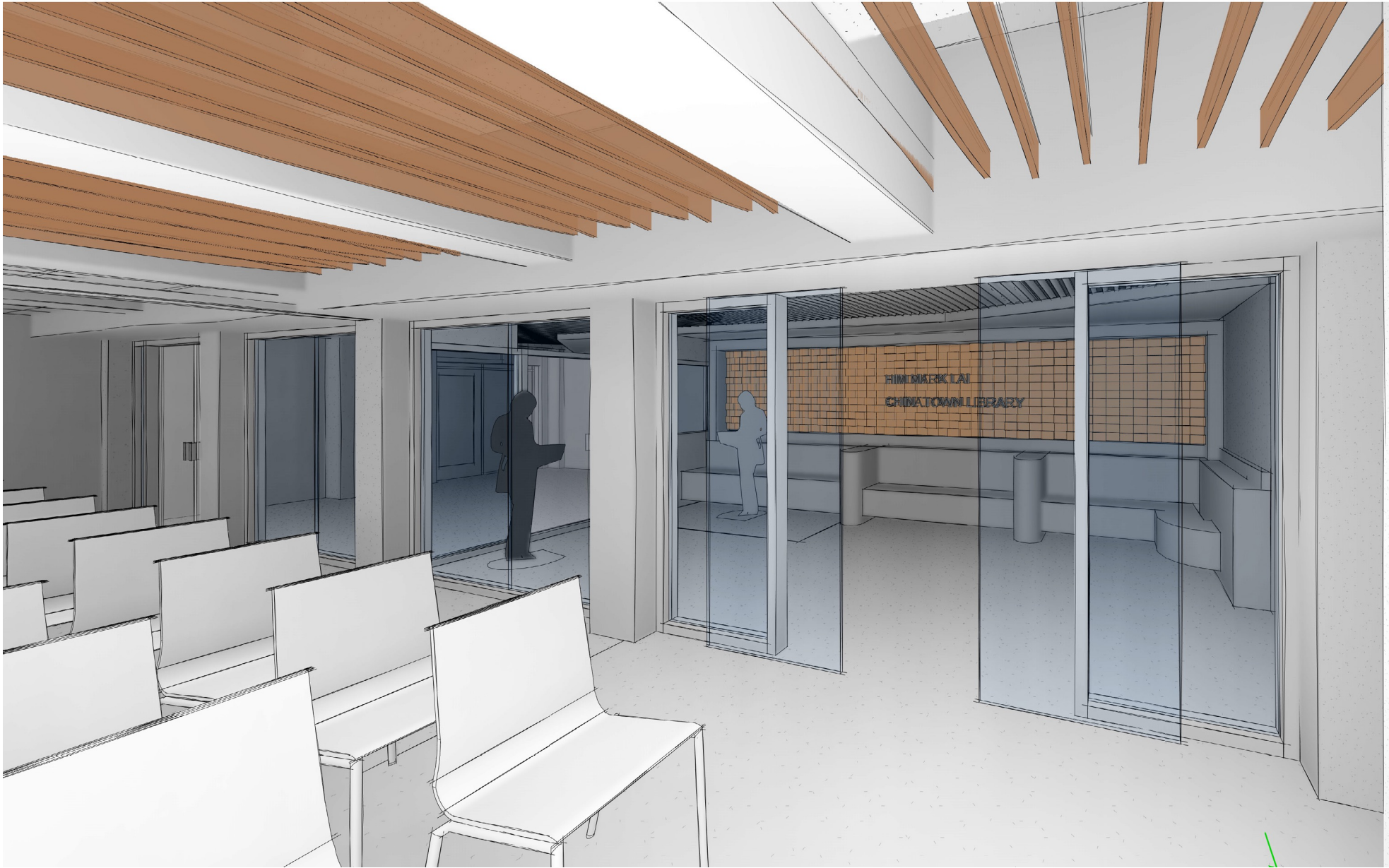

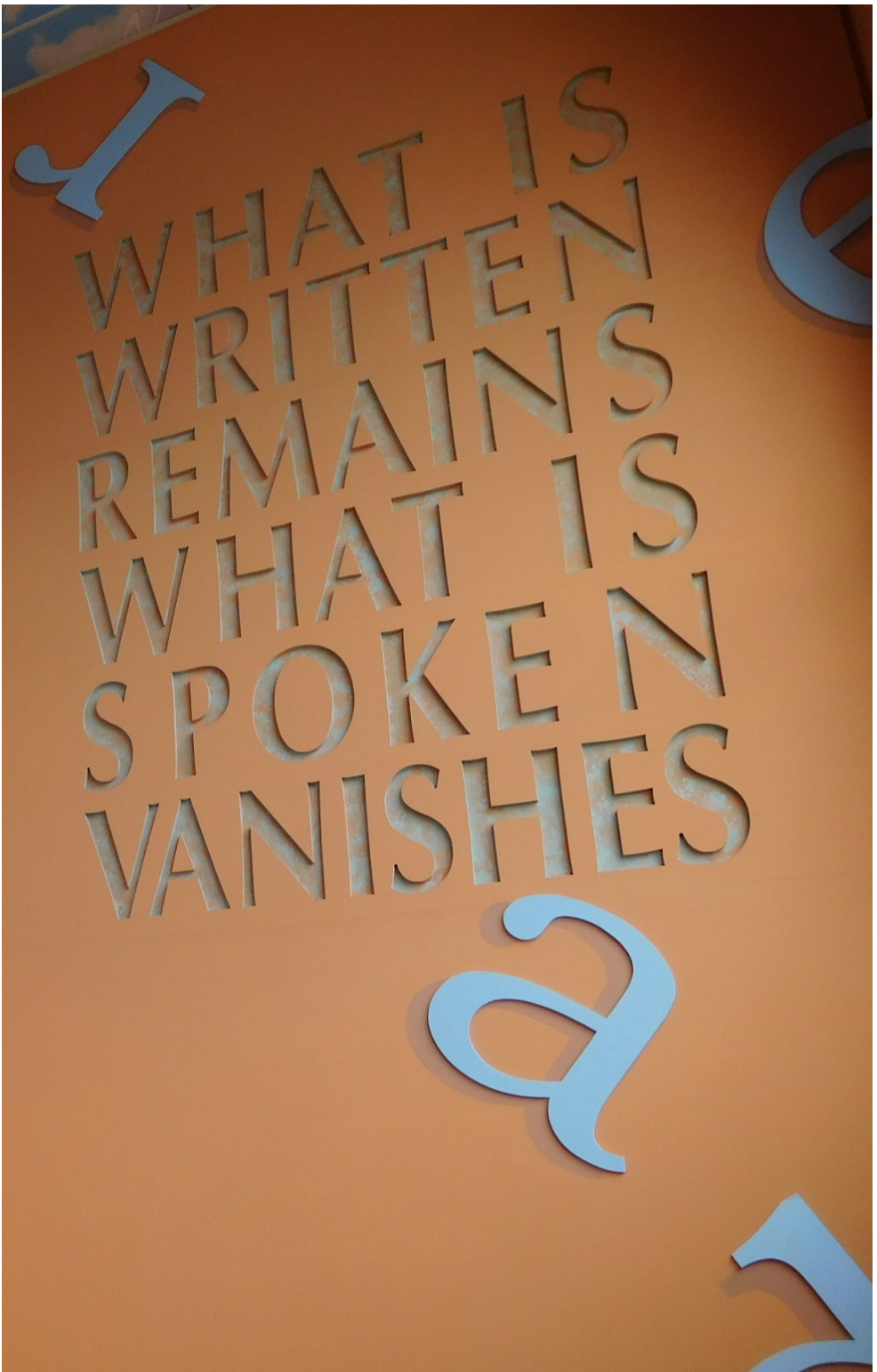
