## City Librarian's Report - Dolly Goyal

- 10,000 people have already signed up for the Summer Stride Challenge!
- Read to Recovery Program
  - Park Branch manager, Doreen Horstin, received a <u>commendation from Supervisor Matt</u> <u>Dorsey</u> for her work in developing this groundbreaking program.
  - Read to Recovery provides free-to-keep addiction recovery books at the Main, Park and Eureka Valley Branch libraries. The program will expand to all San Francisco public library locations by next year.
  - The program has received national attention and is spreading to cities in New York and Oregon.
- Pride Parade
  - o The SFPL Bookmobile and over fifty library staff participated.
  - A reporter for the San Francisco Standard joined the contingent along the parade route and on the bookmobile.
- A graduation ceremony was held for five students from SFPL's Career Online High School diploma program.

  - Nicky (OVI) How can the public provide comments at the Library Commission meetings?

Shaub - The public can give comments in-person after each agenda item. They have 3 minutes, 2 minutes if there are a lot of people waiting to comment. Remote public comments are not allowed unless there is an access issue.

• Katherine (CHI) – Is there an update on the Chinatown renovation? Alcalá-Veraflor – The goal is to move into the temporary location in January.

# <u>Branch Open Houses – Rebecca Alcalá-Veraflor</u>

- Branch Open Houses
- Branch open houses are opportunities for libraries to not only share information, but to be community catalyzers and provide a way for community members to meet and make social connections.
- The 27 Open Houses are 27 neighborhood celebrations
  - o Some will have a theme: Chinese New Year, Viva Latinx Heritage, Star Wars Day
  - Activities can include a City Guides Tour, book giveaways, music and dance performances, and crafts.
  - Community groups and other organizations also participate: Museum of Craft and Design, San Francisco Symphony, San Francisco Fire Department, and San Francisco Environment.
  - o Donations from local businesses provide food and prizes.
- Q&A
  - Ruth (NVA) Did the Library participate in Carnaval this year? The Library usually has a table. I didn't see one this year.
    - Alcalá-Veraflor Yes, this year the Library was in the parade! We do usually table maybe next year we can do both.
  - Katherine (CHI) Chinatown had 200 people during the first hour of their open house.
    - Alcalá-Veraflor Anza had their open house on a Wednesday evening from 4-7pm. Usually at that time they have about 150 patrons in the branch. That night they had over 600 people. We have open houses every year to remind people that we are here and to draw people inside.
  - Nora (GPA) Can you share the open house attendance numbers with the group?
     Alcalá-Veraflor Yes, I'll share that with the group at the next meeting.
  - Nicky (OVI) How are the programs funded?
    - Alcalá-Veraflor Programs are a mix of paid performers and presenters and librarian led activities. Paid performers/presenters receive an honorarium from the Friends of San Francisco Public Library. Every year we work with the Friends on a budget for performers, presenters and programming supplies for each branch. Some branches have donor designated funds. If the performer or vendor is registered with the City, we can use our City budget.
  - A.J. (ANZ) Is it possible to fix the dates of the open houses?
     Alcalá-Veraflor The dates are usually in the same month every year.
  - Monica (WSA) The trip to Muir Woods from the Western Addition Branch was wonderful. Is it possible to have trips year-round?

Alcalá-Veraflor – For the past seven years we have partnered with the National Park Service to provide community shuttles from different branch libraries to local national parks. Currently the trips are only available during the summer as part of our Summer Stride program.
