Developed and facilitated a replicable process for identifying and prioritizing work needed to implement Vision 2030.

Process Summary

1. Alignment on Goals & Objectives

Create a concise list of measurable goals and objectives that, if met, will signify Vision 2030 has been achieved.

2. Project Ideation

Brainstorm a wish list of potential projects for the fiscal years ahead.

3. Project Prioritization

Develop a prioritization model and apply to each project proposal.



Phase I in Detail: Goals & Objectives

Approach:

- Transform Library leadership's interpretation of Vision 2030 into a comprehensive and actionable list of goals and objectives.
- Small group reflections on clarity and ability to organize and plan divisional work around the proposed set of goals and objectives.

Deliverable:

• 13 goals, each with 4-6 objectives.

Definitions

"Goal"

with s

High level SFPL Identity statement of the kinds of impacts we want to have by 2030 with some level of direction

"Objective"

An more specific accomplishment or impact on patrons or the organization. Provides additional context to a goal

One (or more) thing(s) we do to achieve an objective: programs, policy changes, processes, etc.



Phase II in Detail: Project Ideation

Approach:

- Individual and collective brainstorming for each goal.
- Small group reflections on each project idea brainstormed.

Deliverable:

 108 unique project ideas brainstormed across all 13 goals.


Phase III in Detail: Project Prioritization

Approach:

- Collect and discuss impact and effort information for each project idea.
- Management Team discussion about which project ideas should be prioritized for FY26.

Deliverable:

- Impact/Effort designations for 108 project ideas
- FY26 prioritization with votes, comments, and concerns for each project

Tracking Progress

- Clear Ownership: Assigned project leads and executive sponsors
- Defined Scope and Goals: Projects have dedicated charters
- Centralized Progress Tracking: We use a master project tracker
- Consistent Updates: All leads share monthly updates
- Dedicated Oversight: RSA Analyst oversees project process
