
Expanding Information Access for Incarcerated People


Mellon Grants Snapshot

\$4,341,000 total funds awarded:

- \$2,000,000 for two-year period
 January 2022 December 2023
- \$375,000 award to continue grant work
 October 2023 December 2024
- \$1,966,000 for two-and-a-half-year period
 November 2024 June 2027















Mapping Library Services

Expanding Services Together Cohort


