MAIN LIBRARY TIMELINE

- **1879:** First San Francisco Public Library opens in Pacific Hall on Bush Street
- **1888:** The Library moves to the Larkin Street wing of City Hall
- **1903:** Architect Daniel Burnham, leader of the City Beautiful movement, begins to design a master plan for San Francisco, including a Civic Center with a new library building.
- **1906:** Earthquake and fire destroys San Francisco City Hall including the Main Library and its collection.
- **1907:** Temporary Main Library is built at Hayes and Franklin streets.
- **1917:** New Main Library at Civic Center is dedicated and opens to the public.
- **1943:** Main Library reaches capacity.
- 1974: The Library Commission, Friends of the San Francisco Public Library, Keep Libraries Alive! and other citizen groups fight to retain Marshall Square as the site for a new main library. The original Main Library was housed in the building that is now the Asian Art Museum.
- **1987:** Mayor Feinstein calls for a new main library in Marshall Square as part of a Civic Center master plan.
- **1988:** Voters approve a bond measure for \$109.5 million to construct a new 376,000-square-foot main library and renovate a few branches.
- **1989:** The Library Commission hires **Pei Cobb Freed & Partners** of New York and **Simon Martin-Vegue Winkelstein Moris** of San Francisco as the building's architects.
- **1992:** A groundbreaking ceremony is held in Marshall Square.
- **1993:** Construction begins on March 15.
- **1996:** The Main Library opens on April 18.
- **2008:** The Main Library's First Floor renovation is completed, resulting in an additional 6,000 square feet of publicly accessible space.
