The Marina Branch Library was San Francisco's 23rd branch. It originally opened in 1954 on the site formerly known as Funston Playground (now Moscone Playground). The midcentury modern, reinforced brick masonry building was fully renovated and enhanced, reopening in 2007 as the fourth branch completed in the Branch Library Improvement Program.
