- ♦ **Ancestry Library Edition** – Genealogical collection including immigration, church, court, death, birth and census records. Available on SFPL computers for free. Also at ancestry.com
- ♦ **FamilySearch** – Digitized county records, including San Francisco and other California counties. familysearch.org
- ♦ **Heritage Quest** – Includes U.S. federal census records and full text family history books. Available on SFPL computers. Access from outside the library requires SFPL library card. sfpl.org
- ♦ **San Francisco Chronicle Historical Database** – Searchable full text newspaper, 1865-1922. Access from outside the library requires SFPL library card. sfpl.org
- ♦ **Library of Congress Chronicling America** – Searchable full text newspapers 1836-1922, including the Morning Call (1890-1895) and the San Francisco Call (1895-1913). chroniclingamerica.loc.gov

BIRTH & DEATH CERTIFICATES

The City and County of San Francisco maintains a continuous record of births and deaths that have occurred within the city since April 1906.

Most recent 3 years (Dept. of Public Health)

Many religious groups have records prior to the 1906 earthquake. If the deceased was Catholic, contact Holy Cross Cemetery at (650) 756-2060 or holycrossceteries.com. Episcopal records remain with the parish. Closed parishes records are archived with the Episcopal Diocese of California at (415) 673-5015 or diocal.org.
