# It Takes a Village

- Lava Mae's Pop-Up Care Village (PUCV) program mobilizes nonprofits, social entrepreneurs and city agencies to the streets to dramatically increase access to critical services for people experiencing homelessness
- The partners who pop up with us at each event are recruited according to three basic service tenants: community enrichment, restorative services, and advancement opportunities
- 2018 Strategy: improve advancement opportunities for our guests by hosting theme-based events
- Six themes for the year are: **Public Health, Employment, Mental Health, Housing Resources, Legal Resources, Nutrition and Body Care**
- Partnership with the SFPL Main Library helps to create a deep sense of Community with a safe, accessible event layout, heartfelt hospitality of our volunteers and partners, festive visuals, live music, special flourishes and socializing areas creates an uplifting and supportive environment for our grateful guests

17 service partners alongside 40 volunteers to serve 363 guests

## PUCV partnership hosted 5 healthcare/medical care nonprofits to serve our guests!

- Medical services rendered were HIV, HEP C testing, harm reduction supplies, eczema, hypertension, podiatry problems, upper respiratory infection, dermatology problems, lice, mental health, and alcohol dependence
